Markus Huber was born in Munich, Germany in 1968. As a soloist of the Tölzer Knabenchor, he worked from an early age with notable musicians such as Herbert von Karajan, James Levine, Wolfgang Sawallisch, Nicolaus Harnoncourt and Dennis Russel Davies. He studied at the Musikhochschule in Munich and Vienna with Leopold Hager (conducting) and Karl-Hermann Mrongovius (piano) amongst others. At that time, he worked as répétiteur for the stage direction class of August Everding and held a teaching position for piano accompaniment.

Markus Huber began his conducting career as répétiteur and conductor at the Landestheater Detmold. One year later, he held the same position as well as that of the second chorus director at Opernhaus Chemnitz, where he was appointed principal conductor of the Collegium Instrumentale Chemnitz in 1999. Between 2002 and 2007, he was principal guest conductor of the Bulgarian Chamber Orchestra, and in 2003 he became principal conductor of Westsächsisches Sinfonieorchester Leipzig. Since 2008, Markus Huber has been the Music Director of Opera Pforzheim.

Markus Huber took the stand at many renowned orchestras, such as the Philadelphia Orchestra, the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra, ORF-Symphonieorchester and Saarländischer Rundfunk/Germany, Louisiana Symphony, Florida Symphony, Minnesota Symphonie Orchestra,, Cincinatti Symphonie Orchestra, Colorado Symphonie Orchestra, Omaha Symphonie Orchestra, Detroit Symphonie Orchestra, Grand Rapids Symphonie Orchestra, Nashville Symphonie Orchestra, Utah Symphonie Orchestra, Des Moines Symphonie Orchestra, Tucson Symphonie Orchestra. Also in Kanada the Kitchener Symphonie Orchestra and Toronto Symphonie Orchestra.

After his huge succes at his first appearance in New Orleans 2012 the orchestra invited Mr Huber immediately again for the season 2013/14. He will conduct in November works of Wagner, Rachmaninoff and Tschaikowsky.

In 1999, he won the second prize of the international conducting competition "Boris Perrenoud" in Vienna. (A first prize was not awarded).
